To encourage maximum participation, there are three divisions for Homecoming teams each year: the Flame Division for Student Organizations and Groups of Students, the Bonfire Division for Social Greek lettered organizations, and the Inferno Division for Housing & Residence Life.

- 1. Any 1 or more student organizations (up to three) or affiliated group of students (i.e.- a leadership role group, a class, a cohort, a VSU program, leader team) are welcome to participate in the Flame Division as pairings. Flame Division participants must compete in at least 4 of the Flame Division of the Spirit Contests.
- 2. Any team competing in the Flame Division will not be allowed to compete in any other division for points.
- 3. This division will compete for The Flame Cup and the winner will be announced and presented the Cup at halftime of the Homecoming Game on October 19. Second and third place will also be announced.
- 4. The Flame Cup will be awarded to the organization that accrues the most Spirit points over the course of the week's competitions. These are allocated based on the number of events that each group participates in.
- 5. Flame Division has an "Open Pairings" rule, meaning organizations may pair up with whatever groups they want.
- 1. The Bonfire Division is only open to Social Greek Organizations, they must be a part of CPC, IFC, NPHC or MGC.
- 2. Bonfire Division participants must compete in at least 4 of the activities.
- 3. Bonfire Division has an "Closed Pairings" rule, meaning organizations are paired up through the Fraternity & Sorority Life Office.
- 4. The Bonfire Division will compete for the Bonfire Trophy. The winner will be announced and presented with the Bonfire Trophy at the Homecoming Game on October 19. The 2nd and 3rd place winner will be announced.
- 5. Any organization/group competing in the Bonfire Division will not be allowed to compete in any other division for points.
- 6. The Bonfire Trophy will be awarded to the team that accrues the most Spirit points over the course of the week's competitions. These are allocated based participation and placement in events.
- 7. 50 PTs will be given to the groups who host two (2) hangout events with their team before the start of Homecoming.

- 1. The Inferno Division is only open to Housing Halls. Inferno Division participants must compete in at least 4 of the activities.
- 2. Any Hall competing in the Inferno Division will not be allowed to compete in the Flame Division or Bonfire Division for points.
- 3. This division will compete for The Inferno Cup and the winner will be announced and presented the Cup at halftime of the Homecoming Game on the 19th. The 2nd and 3rd place winner will be announced.
- 4. The Inferno Cup will be awarded to the Hall that accrues the most Spirit points over the course of the week's competitions. These are allocated based on the number of events that each group participates in.

- 2. Sidewalk chalk designs and Valdosta State Trademarks should not be used in conjunction with: alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, illegal and recreational drugs & drug paraphernalia, gambling products, firearms or other weapons, profanity, sexual acts & sexually oriented goods, statements impugning other universities, racist, hateful, demeaning or degrading language or statements.
- 3. Members of your organization or hall must draw the sidewalk displays.
- 4. ONLY washable materials may be used (chalk, charcoal, etc.)
- 5. Automatic disqualification will ensue if it is discovered permanent materials have been used such as paint, hairspray or any other materials.
- 6. The displays must be finished and ready to be judged by Wednesday, October 16th at

- 1. All persons in your group must be a member of your organization or hall and must be current VSU students and bring their current VSU ID.
- 2. Each group should consist of Minimum number of 3 people; maximum number of 20 people.
- 3. All groups must incorporate the Blazer Hoedown Throwdown theme.
- 4. Each group should submit an mp3 file of the music they are going to be using for the performance no later than Wednesday, October 9, by 5:30 pm. If the organization submits the wrong that they wish to use, they will be disqualified. https://valdosta.presence.io/form/homecoming-2024-blazer-hoedown-throwdown
- 5. Any late submissions at all will result in a 10-point deduction and occurrence. Upon receiving their 3 violations, a team will be disqualified from competing.
- 6. All music and choreography should be in good taste and should not contain obscenities or vulgarities. Any music or choreography judged in poor taste will result in your organization's immediate disqualification. Remember, you are representing your organization and your university.
- 7. The performance is to be no longer than 4 minutes. You will be timed. If your group's performance exceeds 4 minutes, you will be immediately disqualified.
- 8. Each group is responsible for its own props. Props used in the competition must be removed that night at the completion of the event. If everything is not removed the team will forfeit the points they received from the competition.
- 9. Use of glitter (on the body or on a sign) or confetti will result in immediate disqualification; any infracting group will be charged a cleaning fee. If your group would like to use confetti it will need to be the stay-attached streamers and approved by the Homecoming Steering Committee.
- 10. No throwing items onto the gym floor or in stands.
- 11. No cheerleading stunts will be allowed in any performances. No performer may be lifted off the floor by another performer(s).
- 12. All costumes must be appropriate. The Homecoming Steering Committee, and any Student Life Staff Member have the right to disqualify teams who do not adhere to this rule.

13. Numbers will be drawn to determine the order of appearance. You will be told your group number at report time.

- 1. Check-in Saturday, October 19th with Student Life in the Oak Street Parking Lot. Float entries are to arrive and check in at 10:00am sharp.
- 2. Floats or golf carts may be decorated however desired, as long as it incorporates the Homecoming theme and is tasteful. Float designs should not be used in conjunction with alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, illegal and recreational drugs & drug paraphernalia, gambling products, firearms or other weapons, profanity, sexual acts & sexually oriented goods, statements impugning other universities, racist, hateful, demeaning or degrading language or statements.
- 3. The parade route will begin at Oak Street Parking Lot, continue to Brookwood, then turn right onto Patterson, turn left onto Anne St., then turn left onto Williams St, turn left on College St., procced to Patterson then turn right. The procession will end in the Oak Street Parking Deck.
- 4. No swerving while driving the parade route.
- 5. Organizations with trailers must have a personal vehicle to pull the trailer. Drivers must have a valid Driver's License.
- 6. Do not allow any spectators on the side of the road to jump onto any parade cars or floats.
- 7. Do not throw any items from your vehicle or float to spectators. Feel free to pass things out by handing things off to spectators.
- 8. Organization members may ride on the trailer or the golf cart (number of persons may not exceed maximum vehicle weight limitations), walk beside it, or a combination of both.
- 9. Organizations who are using golf carts are not allowed to have members hang off or not be seated on the cart.
- 10. Possession and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages on parade units is prohibited.
- 11. All vehicle occupants must be inside the passenger compartment or in a truck bed. Riding on the roof or anything not suited for a passenger is prohibited.
- 12. The University participants will comply fully with all local ordinances pertaining to parades. If any of these rules are violated, even on the day of the parade,

- 1. All campaigning and/or campaigning materials must be purchased by the individual.
- 2. Ads in the student newspaper (The Spectator) and other campus media may not be purchased with monies from student fees that are allocated to specific organizations and/or departments but may be purchased with other funds.
- 3. Candidates can only be sponsored by one (1) organization. Even if a candidate is a part of multiple organizations, they can only have one sponsor.
- 4. Candidates can only put one organization logo on their marketing.
- 5. Campaign posters shall be hung <u>only</u> on bulletin boards and other approved sites.
- 6. No campaign posters or signs may be placed on the doors, walls, windows, glass, or organic surfaces in any campus buildings.
- 7. Please consult the person or persons responsible for the location of the desired posting for other rules or restrictions for that location.
- 8. No cellophane-type tape or other materials that may cause permanent damage may be used to hang or secure campaign materials.
- 9. Tags may be worn by the candidate ("Hello, I'm Jane Doe") as a source of identification only.
- 10. Sashes must be worn to all campus events related to Homecoming.
- 11. Organizations cannot pay for any campaign materials for their candidate.
- 12. No platforms are allowed to be posted, talked about or shared.
- 13. At official events every member of the Court must wear their "Homecoming Court" sash.

- a. Select the Homecoming Steering Committee in the "Your Organization" drop down menu.
- 15. Every candidate has until Friday, October 18 by 5:00 PM to remove all campaign materials. If they are not removed by the deadline the candidate will be disqualified.
- 16. Please address all questions before you and/or your sponsoring group begins campaigning to ensure that all rules are followed to avoid disqualification. If any of these rules are broken, the candidate will be disqualified immediately.
- 17. Funding Amount:
 - a. Candidates can spend up to \$500 on items for their campaign
 - b. Candidates can get up to \$300 worth of items or services that are donated by a company.
 - c. All items need to have receipts or item value that are turned in on Friday, October 18 by 4:00 PM to homecoming@valdosta.edu.

The 2024 Homecoming Court will be chosen by a campus-wide election. Voting will take place on Blazerlink. The first election for King & Queen will take place on October 16, 2024 from 1:00 AM to 11:59 PM to pick the top five candidates. The election results will be announced at the Pep Rally and posted on social media (@VSUHomecoming).

The second election will be held on Thursday, October 17, 2024 from 9:00 PM to 12:00PM to select the official King & Queen. The 2024 Homecoming King & Queen will be announced during the halftime show at the Homecoming Game on Saturday, October 15th.

The election for Class Prince & Princesses will take place on October 16 2024, from 1:00 AM to 11:59 PM to pick the winners for each Class Prince & Princess. The winners will be crowned at the Homecoming Pep Rally.

The following policy is designed to allow registered, in good standing, student organizations, administrative and academic departments, and individual employees to properly post sheet signs and banners on the VSU campus in a manner consistent with the mission of the University.

All banners and sheet signs to be displayed on the VSU campus must be approved by the Office of Student Life (Student Union, 229-333-5674). Banners/sheet signs must be sponsored by a VSU department or registered organization

- 1. To be hung in front of the Student Union must have additional approval by the Office of Student Life (Student Union, 333-5674)
- 2. To be hung on VSU shuttle buses must be approved by the Parking & Transportation Office (Sustella Parking Deck, 293-PARK.).
- 3. May be hung from trees (but not Pine Trees or trees surrounding the Student Union). No Banners or Sheet Signs may be hung from or attached to buildings, fences, lampposts, or walls.
- 4. Can be displayed up to ten (10) days before the event and both the Banner/Sheet Sign and the Rope or Twine must be removed by the sponsoring organization or individual within one day after the event. In special circumstances, approval may be granted for longer display periods. Materials for creating or hanging sheet signs/banners are not provided by the Office of Student Life.
 - a. Must include the Name of the VSU sponsoring organization(s), department(s), or individual(s);
 - b. the Date, Time, and Location of the program or event (if applicable): and
 - c. The Required Office of Student Life Approval.
- 5. May not be obscene or defamatory, and must not violate University, federal, state, or local laws.

- 6. May be hung/attached using only. Twine, String or Rope and must not be attached in ways that will cause damage to trees, light posts, or other objects. All String Twine, Rope, etc. must be removed within one day after the event. May not be suspended from the walkway over Oak Street. May not be displayed in areas that will obstruct traffic or the normal use of facilities.
- 7. Will be approved on a first come, first served basis.
- 8. The Office of Student Life is not responsible for any loss of, or damage done to a banner/sheet sign posted on the VSU campus.
- 9. Any Banners/Sheet Signs which violate this posting policy will be removed regardless of content or sponsoring entity and disposed of by the Office of Student Life. The first time this policy is violated, a warning letter will be issued to the responsible organization or individual. Further instances of failure to comply with these regulations will result in loss of privileges for hanging sheet signs and banners on campus for the remainder of that semester, and/or loss of facilities use privileges, and/or other appropriate disciplinary measures.
- 10. Complaints filed against any University student, faculty, staff member, or student organization that destroys, defaces, or removes banners/sheet signs without permission will be under the jurisdiction of the University Judicial System.
- 11. The University reserves the right to impose reasonable restrictions and/or requirements concerning time, place, and manner of posting activities. These restrictions may be in addition to, or in lieu of, those outlined in this policy. The university reserves the right to update and amend this policy at any time.
